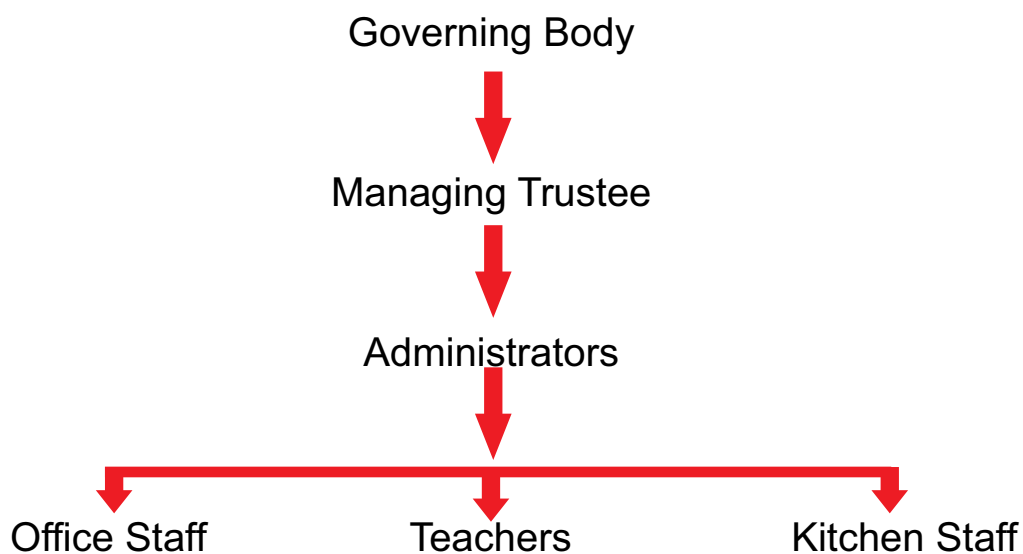

- Twenty seven students passed in 10th Std. Maharashtra Board exam in March 2017 with the good percentage. More than ten students got above 60%.
- Three students passed in 12th std. Junior college successfully.
- Ms. Aparna Gattana successfully completed B. Com (Bachelor of Commerce).
- Ms. Anjali Kharvi is doing second year Bachelors of Account and Finance at B.L. Amlani College at Vile Parle west.
- Rahul Kharvi is in the Final year Electronic Engineering at Bhagubhai College at Vile Parle west.
- 135 kids at the age of 3 to 4 years were taken care in our kindergarten at our six community centres.
- We had 465 school and college going students under our care.
- Some of our boys and girls continue with their higher studies in various fields like Arts, Commerce and Science.
- 225 children from 5th to 10th class are undergoing computer training in Shakti, Sunder Nagar, Dindoshi, Sahar, Bamanwada Hill and Sakinaka centres of Ashadeep.



- Members of Toy Bank provided different types of educational toys to the children. They visit regularly our
- centres to teach the children how to use the toys.
- One of our students Mahesh Dede completed his one year Motor Mechanical at Don Bosco, Kurla and started working.
- Sumit Javras and Nimesh Warli completed their two year ITI government course in the field of Air Conditioning and Refrigeration. 2 boys are doing their second year training in Electronics.
- Three boys those who completed their training in Air conditioning and Refrigeration are going for the apprenticeship in different companies.
- Many of our children were awarded with merit certificates and prizes in various competitions like Writing, Drawing, Singing, Elocution, Sports like Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Volleyball, Football, Best Students award etc. Some of the children got scholarship from their schools.

Moving away from the daily routine, we ensure that we provide a holistic learning approach to the children through various activities and celebrating the festivals with great pomp and cheer.

- Children of Ashadeep organized the Teacher's Day Programme to show their gratitude towards their teachers.



- Children celebrated the Indian festivals like Rakshabandhan, Dussera, Diwali and Holi.
- The tailoring classes at Dindoshi Centre is going on smoothly and the students are taking keen interest to learn. 24 young girls and women are attending the class regularly.

- Christmas Celebration conducted by FedEx Corporate through United Way of Mumbai at Sahar Centre for 90 children and their staff. All children received gifts. 100 children visited to star India TV at Lower Parel. Children's day was celebrated with the sports, games, craft, drawing, fancy dress and distributed prizes to the children.



- During summer vacation 150 children enjoyed Bal Mela at Divine Child High school, Joy for reading workshop conducted by United Way of Mumbai at St. Stanislaus High School Bandra, Focus on Photography Workshop conducted by United of Mumbai.
- R.K Foundation Bangalore, Epson Company provided notebooks to all our school and college going children.



- The Finance Literacy workshop was conducted by DBS Bank on the occasion of Women's Day for all the staff of Ashadeep.

- Our dispensary at Dindoshi centre providing basic health care facilities to the poor people in Santosh Nagar Slums. The Doctor visits the dispensary thrice a week to attend the patients for the viral fever, cold, cough and other diseases. Special care is given to T.B. and heart patients also Sugar test and ECG is available.
- We provided sarees, bed sheets, towels, to the mothers of the children under our care twice a year. In the same way the children are provided with new dresses, pants, shirts, school uniforms, bags and other study material.



- Volunteers conducted Personality Development, Career Counselling and Yoga Classes for the children.
- All the children are served breakfast, mid-day meal, milk and snacks everyday.



- There are many college students and volunteers are associated with Ashadeep to teach our children subjects like Maths, Science, English, Communication skills and General Knowledge etc.

My achievement since I have learnt Tailoring.

I would like to share about my family and myself. We are 8 members in my family. 6 children and parents. We are staying in a rented room at Dindoshi, Goregaon.

Being the eldest daughter, I had to give up my school at the early age of 10 yrs. I had been busy taking care of the little ones. One day while working, hot water fell on my body and I was burnt. My mother brought me to Ashadeep dispensary. I got medicine for my wound as well as a best tonic for my future life. I was asked to come to Ashadeep for studies.

Very often we had no food, proper clothes to wear and even water to have proper bath. Our life was miserable. My father was very poor. He was a hawker and was earning RS. 20/ to 30/. That was not enough for the room rent, electricity bill and to take care of us. Every now and then we were changing the room here and there due to the heavy rent. My mother stayed at home to look after the children. Later she was appointed to work in Ashadeep kitchen at Dindoshi centre.

Our life started changing slowly when we all started going to Ashadeep. Ashadeep was heaven for us. We were like free birds. Time to time we got food to eat, clothes to wear and we enjoyed during the day in the centre. Even for the night we got food. Meanwhile I learnt to stitch clothes from the centre. In this way my family succeeded in progressing. As the years passed by, the expenses increased due to the inflation. It was a burden for my parents. My father could not get any better job. Mother was not happy to stay at home in this situation. She couldn't bear all these problems, so she left us and went away. So once again all the responsibilities came on my shoulder as the eldest one in the family. But I got courage to go forward. I am working at Dindoshi centre as a tailor. The tailoring class is smoothly going on with the support of “PROiNFANTS”, Barcelona Spain. Due to the support and encouragement I am standing on my own feet and look after the family. I am very proud of Ashadeep. Otherwise what would have been my life and my family without any support? Ashadeep should grow more widely and help many others like me through the help of the well-wishers.

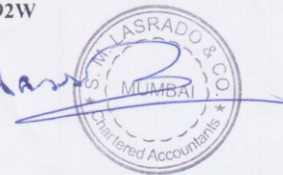

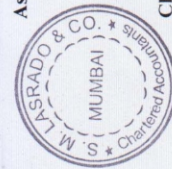
