Message from Managing Trustee

Dear Friends of Ashadeep Association

We remember you very specially because you are part of Ashadeep. You may be eagerly waiting to know and to hear about the seeds you have sown to make our work fruitful. With your support we managed to do our day to day work smoothly, otherwise it was impossible for us to continue.

You should be proud of yourself for the kind and generous support that you give us to take care of our poor and needy children. We are very grateful to you dear friends for your thoughtfulness towards the helpless and down trodden children. Most of them starve very often. Even in their rooms where



they live, they cannot stretch their legs properly while sleeping, because all the members of the family have to adjust in the same room. These are the poor people we help at Ashadeep. By helping these people you are doing a wonderful work. You are giving them a new life. It is a great blessing for you and your family members. Whatever help you give, doesn't go waste. We enjoy working for the poor children. Let us work together to give life and joy to all needy.

All these children live in the nearby slums in small rooms. Some of them stay in rented rooms. The children very often don't get enough sleep, as they have to go to collect water at night. Also, in the morning they need to get up early to reach their school at 7.00 a.m. They enjoy and feel happy to come to our Ashadeep centres. Our seven centres are open throughout the week except Sundays. On school holidays the children remain in Ashadeep for the whole day. Ashadeep does not have a big place with many rooms. We manage and use the same rooms for multiple activities like studying, eating, playing, sleeping, etc. Since the children are occupying the rooms throughout the year, we incur lot of expenses in maintaining the rooms. Children who are under our care are quite healthy. We conduct dental and medical checkup for all of them. Also we have our own medical centre, where they can get medicines free of charge. We provide them with uniforms and books for the school, and twice a year we give them new dresses, shirts, pants etc. Also, for their mothers, who are widows, we give sarees, bedsheets, towels, and financial aid.

The schools work in two shifts, from morning 7.00 a.m. to 12.45 p.m. and 1.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. When the children come to our centre in the morning, they get milk or breakfast. They are helped to do the school homework and studies by our staff and volunteers. Before leaving for school they are served with an afternoon meal, so that they don't remain hungry. The children, who attend morning schools, come to the Ashadeep centres in the afternoon. They are provided with afternoon meal. After that they relax for some time and then sit for their studies. In the evening before they go home, they get snacks and milk.

During their school vacations, we book a special place for them, near the sea shore for a camp for recreation activities for six weeks. We take boys and girls in groups of around 80 for almost 12 days each and then the next group follows. There is a swimming pool, slides, swings and play grounds for the children. They enjoy the most over there, as they are free from all the worries.

We have families of all religions, so we celebrate the festivals of Hindus, Muslims and Christians.

Ashadeep does all this work, for the children so that they may have a good life and a bright future through good education and health care.

Children are keen on learning computer skills. The young girls and the poor women get an opportunity to learn tailoring. These are the extra benefits our children and the widows always get from Ashadeep.

This year, most of our children have passed with good grades. Few girls who have finished their studies are working outside in offices and are supporting their families. Three boys completed 2 years of technical training certified by the Government and are waiting to get jobs. Six other boys are going for the same technical training in the field of either electronics or Air Conditioning and Refrigeration.

With your kind help we can save a lot of poor children. They can come out of the darkness and be led into the light. God said "Whatever you do to the least of my brothers and sisters you do it for me." To get more information you can visit our website www.ashadeepassociation.org

Events and Activities

1. Food, Clothing and Educational Material:

We provide with sarees, bed sheets and towels, twice a year to the mothers of the children under our care. The children are also provided with new dresses, pants, shirts, school uniforms, books and other study materials twice a year. The children are served mid-day meals, milk and snacks every day.



2. **Dispensary:**

Our dispensary at Dindoshi centre over the years is successfully providing basic health care facilities to the poor people. We have tried our best to provide special care to T.B. and heart patients, handicapped and other diseased. Aasara NGO, Barcelona from Spain also has supported for the dispensary at Dindoshi Centre.





3. Teacher's Day:

The children planned and executed Teachers Day programme, at Sahar centre for all the teaching and non-teaching staff of Ashadeep. They presented a cultural programme followed by many games. The staff were given a small gift as a token of love. All of them had a great time and it was a learning experience for all the children.

4. Tailoring Class:

The sponsorship of "Aasara NGO, Barcelona, Spain" has helped us to continue tailoring classes at Dindoshi centre. More than 36 girls are learning tailoring in Shakti and Dindoshi centres.



5. **Holiday Camp**

As usual the children had been for the Holiday Camp, at Aksa Beach Marve. More than 340 children enjoyed various activities which were conducted by the volunteers. Many individuals and groups volunteered in the Camp. UHP Technologies conducted "Sports Day" for the children in the Holiday Camp and distributed prizes for all the children.

- 6. PUMA Company provided shoes and T-Shirts for the students.
- 7. Many of our well wishers, sponsors and volunteers contributed towards the notebooks for the children. We could provide notebooks to all the children.
- 8. In the month of Jan we could distribute food for 8000 people through ISKCON in the communities across all our 7 centres. We are privileged to have delicious food for our children from ISKCON regularly.



- 9. Parle Products Company is continuing with their kind support by providing every month 10 boxes of delicious Parle G Biscuits.
- The Children are taking keen interest in reading the books in the Libraries in all the seven centres, which was sponsored by Master Shyam Akula under his college project.
- 11. Ashadeep's collaboration with Financial Technologies Company (MCX) has continued since 2008 years through their payroll giving programme "Reach Out".
- 12. There are many volunteers associated with Ashadeep. Volunteers are coming forward to help the children, from various companies, educational institutions and individuals to teach our children subjects like Maths, Science, English, communication skills etc.

Life Stories

Rajaram Phonde (19 years):



I lost my parents when I was very young. I used to live in my native place. My uncle brought me to Mumbai and got me admitted to a Municipal school in Std. 4. He was a very poor man. He did not have any money to spend for my education, food and other expenses.

I heard from my classmates, about Ashadeep, the help that they gave to the poor children and their mothers. Hearing this, my uncle took me to Ashadeep and they accepted me. At that time I was a very lonely child. But that changed when I started going to Ashadeep regularly. I got all what I needed, like good food, decent clothes to wear, help for my studies, special tuitions and guidance for my future. Gradually, I started taking interest in my studies and this helped me to come first in class many times. I gained a lot of self confidence.

It was a very warm atmosphere in Ashadeep and I started growing stronger physically and mentally. I learnt many good values and good habits, which helps me even today.

When I completed my Std. 7 from the Municipal school, through the help of Ashadeep I got admission in a private school for Std. 8.

Due to some trouble, once I left school without informing my uncle and Ashadeep and stayed at home. Sister Huberta and Santosh Sir came to my hut and counselled me and encouraged me to continue my studies. They made me understand the value of education. I felt their concern, love, kindness, and thoughtfulness towards me. That touched my heart. I felt very much at peace and happier with myself. Thereafter, whenever I made any mistake I was corrected by Sister Huberta and she always made me to understand my mistakes. In this way, slowly I realised, that improvement is very important in everyone's life to become a better human beings. I started thinking seriously about my future. I worked hard in my studies and passed Ashadeep was much worried about my future, because I was an orphan. I was advised to take up a training which will be good for my career. I joined Lalji Mehrotra Technical Institute for ITI in Draftsmanship. Through Ashadeep I was able to get sponsorship from SNJ Trust (Mrs. Neena Julka) for two years. I tried my level best and worked hard all the time. I passed with 70% marks. I am unable to express the happiness and the joy that I went through on that day. I achieved something very special for my future. Also, as soon as I got my result, I was selected to do my apprenticeship for a year in Godrej Company.

To all those who were concerned and took trouble to make me what I am today, I wish to express a loving and heartfelt thank you. Today I am very proud of my Ashadeep. I learnt good habits like, reaching out to the needful, to do selfless work, forgiving one another, giving respect to the elders, sharing knowledge with others and loving everyone as brothers and sisters.

Ashadeep is something very special, trying to bring all those who are without hope and light. One thing I admire about Ashadeep is that there is no difference made among the children on the basis of their caste, creed, religion or gender. I thank God for Ashadeep and all those who work hard to uplift the poor and needy children like me. I also thank all those who are supporting Ashadeep to grow and reachout, to the poor to have a bright future.

As our founder Late Dr. Adelheid Hueffer taught always "God's Love and Grace will bring joy and hope to all.

Life Stories

Shalu Dhotre (17 years):



When I was 2 years old, my father committed suicide and my mother left me alone with my grandmother. She brought me to Ashadeep, where she was working. I was very lucky to be in Ashadeep, where I received more than my parents could give me. I grew up here with love, care and understanding. I was provided with all the basic necessities for the studies, food, clothes, tuitions, coaching classes and much more. Also, I got to learn how to dance, sing, cook, and use the computer. I was given responsibilities which I gladly fulfilled. I am grateful for the love and kindness that Ashadeep and my grandmother gave me. I cannot forget the days I spent with my companions and friends at the holiday camp at Marve Aksa beach every year. I used to wait to get the opportunity to enjoy there.

It is a beautiful place, where we can play, shout and enjoy in the sea- shore and the sea. I miss everything these days. At Ashadeep I have got many memories which will follow me as a shadow in my life. When I completed Std. 12, my grandmother retired from Ashadeep; she was 65 years old at that time. I made up my mind to stay with her and support her.

Like me, there are so many poor children who are waiting to get the same opportunities to come up in life. I was lucky to be in Ashadeep to get the benefit for myself. The most precious thing I achieved was my education. Now I can earn and stand on my own feet without any discouragement or fear. I will pray that by the Grace of God, Ashadeep will exist and help many more poor children like me. I thank God for all those who work selflessly to uplift the poor and needy.

I am continuing my studies, and besides that, in my free time I go out to do some work to support my grandmother.

All those who are supporting Ashadeep can be very happy. It is true that every little bit of help which you give to Ashadeep can save a child's future. Nothing will go waste.

Jyoti Patel (36 Years) and Tanish (6 months):



I was rejected by my own family and brought up by Ashadeep. When I was very young, my parents died. No one bothered about me, as all my brothers and sisters were poor and illiterate. When the Ashadeep Centre started near my hut in Sahar Village, I was accepted there as an orphan. Sister Huberta admitted me into a Municipal school for my education. At that time I was staying with my brother. I was the youngest in my family. I did not have water to take a bath and even to wash my face. We had severe water scarcity.

But in Ashadeep, I got my afternoon meal, milk and good treatment for my health. I was always very quiet and never spoke to anyone. After completing Std. 7, I didn't want to study further. I was not happy to stay with my brother and so I was allowed to stay in the Ashadeep Centre and learn tailoring. I did not take much interest and learnt very slowly. The person who took care of me and taught me how to stitch had a lot of patience. After 12 years my brother came to Ashadeep and took me to his house and got me married to an elderly man.

After 4 years of marriage, I became pregnant. As per our customs, my brother brought me to his house in the 7th month of my pregnancy. I was ill treated by my sister-in-law and my nephew. I did not even get proper food to eat or water to have bath in their house. My body was fully swollen up. When Kitty didi heard about me, she immediately called me and arranged for everything that was necessary for me. I got nutritious food and milk from the Sahar centre. Not only that, from time to time I was also sent to the Hospital for regular checkup. I had to undergo a caesarean operation. No one from my family was willing to come with me to the hospital. But God was on my side; from Ashadeep, I got all the support. They looked after me and were beside me even when I was in labour pain.

On 17th May, 2012, I got my first child 'a baby boy'. None of my family members came to see me and my child, but I had people from Ashadeep always coming to me. All the hospital expenses were borne by Ashadeep. After being discharged from the hospital, when I went to my brother's house, my sister-in-law and my nephew did not even allow me to enter their house. I could not share my sorrow with anyone and I suffered everything all alone. But Ashadeep knew and they could feel everything, whatever I was going through. They looked after me and my child in the best way and nourished both of us. I was given all the training on how to take care of my infant child.

The naming ceremony for my son was performed by the team members and the staff of Ashadeep at the Shakti Centre. Kitty did and all the staff gave a beautiful name "Tanish" to my son. I felt great joy when the ceremony was going on. I never dreamt that my son Tanish could have such a heart warming name-day ceremony. My eyes were full of tears and I felt an inner joy inside my heart.

Tanish was loved by all the children and the staff. All the elders were more than my family members. Kitty didi took a lot of trouble and looked after me, as my mother.

My son Tanish is very lucky for me. Now he is 6 months old. He has started smiling and recognising everyone. When I look at him, I feel that he brought a Ray of Hope in my life. I feel someone is there in my life as my own.

I am really very grateful to Late Dr. Hueffer and Ashadeep. If she would have not started this organisation, what would have been to all those who are going through such situations! I sincerely thank Kitty didi for all the trouble she took for my son and me and also Sister Huberta and Dottie didi for all their cooperation.


- No remuneration, sitting fees or any other form of compensation is paid to any board member, except for the Managing Trustee.
