- b. All the 19 students passed 10<sup>th</sup> Std. Maharashtra Board exam in March 2014.
- c. All the 7 students passed 12<sup>th</sup> std. Junior college.
- d. Ms. Najma Shaikh is doing her B.Com degree. Ms. Varsha Kale is doing her engineering degree in Computer Technology. Ms. Meenakshi Mule passed her Diploma in Electronics and is doing her engineering degree.
- e. 16 students are doing their degree courses through various streams.
- f. Throughout the year, 202 children were taken care in our kindergarten (Balwadis) in our six community centres.
- g. We had 415 school and college going students under various programmes.
- h. Children are undergoing computer training in Shakti, Sunder Nagar, Dindoshi, Bamanwada, Bamanwada Hill and Sakinaka centres of Ashadeep. We could get more computers from different companies for the training of children.
- i. 5 boys completed their 2 years ITI Government course in the field of Air Conditioning and Refrigeration and Electronics.
- j. Many girls continue with their higher studies in various fields like Arts, Commerce, Science, Home Science etc.
- k. Many of our children were awarded merit certificates in various competitions.
- I. Many students got prizes and certificates in various competitions like Writing, Drawing, Singing, Sports, Best Students, etc.

## **Events and Activities**

Moving away from the daily routine, we ensure that we provide an all-round learning approach to the children through various activities and celebrating the festive mood with great pomp and cheer.

- a. All the children are served mid-day meal, milk and snacks every day.
- b. The children get complete educational support in the form of study material, assistance in school and college studies, fees, uniform etc.
- c. Many of our well-wishers, sponsors and volunteers contributed towards the notebooks for the children. With this overwhelming response we could provide notebooks to all the children.
- d. We provided sarees, bedsheets, towels, to the mothers of the children under our care. Twice a year the children are provided with new dress, pants, shirts, school uniforms, books and other study material.
- e. The tailoring classes have helped the women and girls from the slum communities, to learn professional skills and earn for their livelihoods. More than 30 young girls and women are learning tailoring in Shakti and Dindoshi centres. The sponsorship of "Aasara NGO, Barcelona, Spain" has helped us to continue tailoring classes at Dindoshi centre.
- f. On 5<sup>th</sup> Sept, 2013, the children organized Teacher's Day Programme at Sahar centre to show their gratitude towards their teachers. This provided the children with an exposure towards organizing and conducting activities.
- g. Keeping the spirit of Unity in Diversity, the children and staff celebrated festivals like Rakshabandhan, Dussera, Diwali, Christmas and Holi.
- h. The dispensary at our Dindoshi centre is providing basic health care facilities to the poor and needy people. It also caters to the basic needs of the T.B. and heart patients, handicapped and other diseases. With the financial support of Aasara NGO, Barcelona, Spain we could provide the facility for 3 days a week. With the kind support of Loberg school from Germany, we could help the poor people with financial assistance in X-ray, various body checkups, minor operations etc. Our association with Dr. Eye Institute, has helped many poor people to get free eye checkups and cataract operations and other treatments at a nominal rate.
- i. The children had been for the Holiday Camp, at Aksa beach, Marve, Mumbai during the Summer school vacation. More than 250 children and widows enjoyed various activities which were conducted by the volunteers. Many individuals and groups volunteered in the Camp.
- j. The children got opportunities to go on educational trips to Hirandani Garden, Corporate offices, National Park, etc.
- k. The children were taught by the volunteers to make handicraft items, cloth bags, greeting cards and diwali lamps to name a few.
- I. In collaboration with Toy Bank, we could start a Toy Library at our Sunder Nagar centre. They provided training to all our kindergarten teachers on the effective use of toys and handling the children.
- m. Children are encouraged to read the books from our library as well.
- n. Ashadeep conducted various training programmes for the teaching and non-teaching staff.
- o. There are many volunteers associated with Ashadeep. Volunteers from various corporates, educational institutions and on personal capacities have reached out to help us by tutoring our children on academic subjects like Maths, Science, English, Communication skills, etc.

## Life Stories

#### Arti Gupta:



I am writing this on behalf of my mother Jugura Gupta. She is 36 years old. At the age of 22 she became a widow. She had 2 little kids upon her shoulder. She was never allowed to go out to work.

She suffered a lot of harassment from her in-laws, except her motherin-law who was courteous and kind to her. She used to be occupied in just hard household chore throughout the day. We stay in a small room in a chawl and in the same small portion of the room, we used to sell vegetables. We had no place to sleep until the vegetables were sold

and the business for the day was completed. Though as children we adjusted and managed but as we grew older, my brother had no place to sleep so he was forced to move to my uncle's place.

When I came to Ashadeep, I was only 2 years and my brother Deepak was 4 1\2 years. Both of us were in the kindergarten. At Ashadeep, both of us were very happy and we received everything what we needed the most. We received lot of love, healthy food and proper guidance. We could comfortably go to school regularly and additionally I could learn dance and singing. Though Deepak did not fare well in his studies, but he had the passion to learn the flute. After completing his studies, he continues to live with our uncle and is working as well.

After completing my 10<sup>th</sup> standard, I joined the tailoring class in Ashadeep centre. We are blessed because of Ashadeep and we got lots of support and guidance from this Institution. We were made to understand the difference between good and bad. We are very grateful to Ashadeep for what we are today and to reach this situation. My mother is also very satisfied now and she is preparing for my marriage as well.

#### Rakesh Khedekar:



My mother cried out in despair. Many were just mute spectators to her situation, butAshadeep was one institution that touched her life and lifted her up from her dire situation. I am Rakesh Khedekar, presently 20 years old and I am proud and happy to share this story of change for both my mother and myself.

When I was brought to Ashadeep by my mother, I was only 7 years old. With torn clothes, long hair, a starving stomach, I had lost the smile from my face. We are 3 brothers and 1sister. My father was a painter and he was an alcoholic. Whatever he earned, he spent it for buying alcohol.

Including my mother, all of us were left starvingfor most of the days. There was no money left for food and it is only few instances, where neighbours offer to share a little part of their meal.My father passed away due to jaundice and post that we were introduced to Ashadeep by a good Samaritan.

When we came to Ashadeep, we found everything so different from our home situation. We were happy and started coming to the centre regularly. We got food at regular intervals and it is the same morsels of meals that we were longing for a long time. We also got complete support from Ashadeep in form of clothes, food, milk, help in education and financial support.

Through medical tests, we were all diagnosed with tuberculosis and could get the medical support from Ashadeep, which helped us recover and live a healthy life.Initially, we stayed with our grandmother in a small hutment in the slums of Jogeshwari, Mumbai. Then my grandmother bought a small room for us which was in a very bad state and not suitable for human settlement. My mother could get the room repaired and renovated with the kind financial support of Ashadeep. Now we all stay in our small room happily.

After I completed my Std. X exam, I went through counselling and then decided to go for the 2 years ITI training in Ac and Refrigeration at Lalji Mehrotra Technical Institute for a Government Diploma course. The fees were very high and we could not afford it. This is when Ashadeep again helped me through a sponsor Mr. Ramesh Bhoominathan for 2 years fees. Meanwhile, my younger brother Sagar too was interested in doing the same course. He was sponsored by Mrs.Neena julka from SNJ Trust for the period of 2 years. Both of us have completed the full course and passed with good marks;68% and 70% respectively. In this manner, out of nothing, we became someone who can live a life without any fear and with great dignity. We are very grateful to Ashadeep and all those who supported us to reach this goal. Each seed one sows can make a huge difference in others' life.

#### Jyoti Mandavkar:



I stayed in Ashadeep for 12 years. During the time, I have achieved many valuable things for my future life. Being a girl child, education was most important and this is whereI got immense support from Ashadeep.

My family condition was very bad once upon a time. My mother brought me and my siblings to Ashadeep when I was 8 years and my brothers were 7 and 2 ½ years. My father passed away due to excessive drinking.He was unable to take care of us and his earning was very little as well. Most of that little money used to be spent on alcohol. We were lucky that Ashadeep had set up its centre close to our hut. We were regular at Ashadeep and felt

very comfortable and homely.We were taken care as a family cares for each other and received lots of love and care from the staff.As a girl when I was growing I had lots of problems with my so-called uncle. His indecent behaviour was troubling me a lot. I suffered in silence for days and months. I was wondering how to escape from this turmoil and Ashadeep was the best source who would hear me patiently. I visited the head office to share my situation. I couldn't open my mouth

and I was trembling with shame and sorrow of what I had been through. I was welcomed lovingly and allowed to stay at Ashadeep for safety reasons. I was very keen in my studies and here I could concentrate on learning without fear. I lived happily and completed my studies up to 12<sup>th</sup> class. I was encouraged to go out and do a part time job, as well as to continue my higher studies. Today, I am very happy to inform thatI completed my graduation in Commerce and I am working and supporting my family as well. With the uncle having moved away, I have started living with my family.

Thousands of children took shelter in Ashadeep. The work which Ashadeep does in such a short span of time cannot be done so easily. They care for each child and even mothers are counselled at regular intervals. I hold Ashadeep as a very special part of my life and cannot forget those days which we spent here. The food, clothes, recreation, the enjoyment and good guidance can transform any child's life. There are so many children who do not get these opportunities. We are blessed and very grateful to all those who helped me reach this goal. It is hard to recollect about the Founder of Ashadeep, late Dr. Adelheid Hueffer, but it is commendable that she came from a distant country to help the poor and needy. She is more like our mother and I am very thankful for shaping my life in the best possible manner.
